

4 Electoral Registration in the Electoral Roll for the Assembly Constituency -

Disqualifications for registration in an electoral roll.

1. According to Section 16 of Representation of People Act 1950, a person shall be disqualified for registration in an electoral roll if (s) he-
 - a. Is not a citizen of India, or
 - b. Is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a competent court, or
 - c. Is, for the time being, disqualified from voting under the provisions of any law relating to corrupt practices and other offences in connection with elections. (See Section 11A of the Representation of People Act, 1951).
2. The name of any person who becomes so disqualified after registration shall forthwith be struck off from the electoral roll in which it is included.
3. No person shall be entitled to be registered in the electoral roll for more than one constituency and no person shall be entitled to be registered in the electoral roll for any constituency more than once as provided in Section 17 and 18 of Representation of People Act 1950
4. According to the provisions of Section 19 of Representation of People Act 1950, subject to the above restrictions, every person shall be entitled to Be registered in the electoral roll of the Constituency who
 - a. is not less than 18 years of age on the qualifying date and
 - b. is ordinarily resident in a constituency,

Electoral Registration Officer

According to the Section 13 B of Representation of People Act 1950 the Electoral Roll for the Assembly Constituency shall be prepared and revised by the Electoral Registration Officer.

Election Commission of India has designated Electoral Registration Officers for the Assembly Constituency vide Notification No. 429 /MT/2008(1) Dated 29 July, 2008

Election Commission of India has appointed Asstt. Electoral Registration Officers of Assembly Constituency vide Notification No.429/MT/2008(2) Dated 29 July, 2008

5 Revision of Electoral Roll

During the revision process the claims, objections, correction in the Electoral Roll are enquired in to by Electoral Registration Officer.

The claims and objection can be filed in the office of Electoral Registration Officers / Asstt. Electoral Registration Officers. The prescribed forms to apply claims and objections are given below.

1.	Claims	Form No.6	To include name in Electoral Roll
2.	Objection	Form No.7	To fill the objection against particular entry in Electoral Roll.
3.	Correction	Form No.8	To Correct the Particulars of the entry in Electoral Roll. To include the Photograph of the Elector in the Photo Electoral Roll.
4.	Transposition of entry	Form No.8A	To Transfer the entry from one Electoral Part to the another Electoral Part with in the Assembly.

Appellate Officer

During the process of preparation or revision of electoral roll, an appeal shall lie from any decision of the Electoral Registration Officers under rules 20, 21 or 21A of the RER,1960 to such officer of the Government as the Election Commission may designate in this behalf under Rule 23 of Registration of Electors Rule 1960. The Deputy Commissioner/District Magistrates/District Collectors are normally appointed as the Appellate Officers.

After the final publication of the roll, an appeal against any order of the Electoral Registration officer, under Section 22 or 23 of the RPA, 1950 shall lie with the Chief Electoral Officer. This is provided under Section 24 of RPA, 1950 and Rule 27 of the Registration of Electors Rule 1960.
